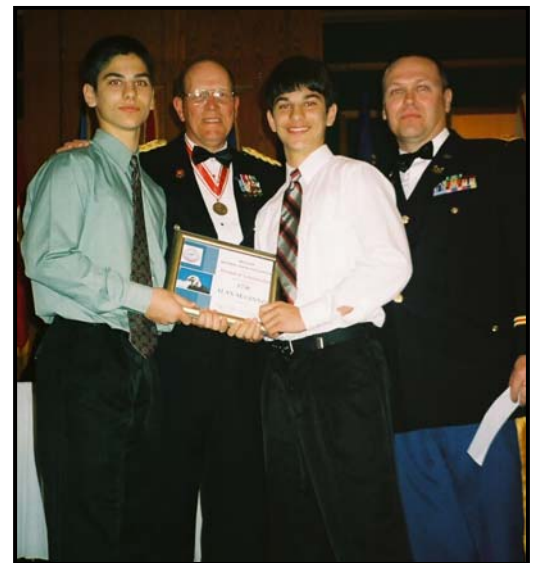
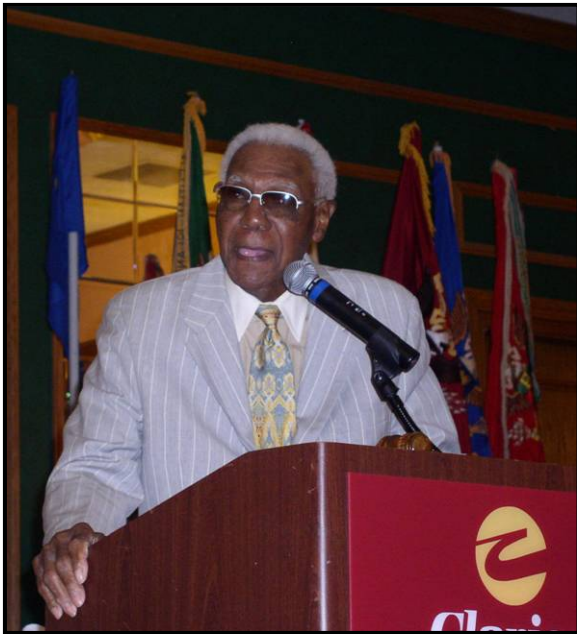

◆ **PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE**



Strength in Numbers – The strength of our association is the voice heard from all of our members, their families, and our supporters in our local communities. I spoke with our delegation at the 59th Annual Missouri National Guard Association Conference on Saturday 22 April, 2006 and shared the following service opportunities.

The National Guard is facing one of the most challenging periods in history with respect to funding for equipment and proposed force structure cuts as the Pentagon struggles with how to pay for costly new weapons systems. Additionally, the Global War on Terror and response to homeland disasters such as Hurricane Katrina have resulted in considerable stress on our members and families. As our Congress deals with how to pay for all of these programs, our efforts to effectively “tell the Guard story” and preserve force structure that will enable us to “answer the call” for both state and federal missions become critically important.

It will take a team effort to succeed in meeting this challenge. As your incoming association president I am asking for your help. Joining our state and national associations is just the beginning.

First, I need your help in recruiting nonmembers. Many of you have fellow Airmen and Soldiers who benefit from our work but aren't contributing. Tell them what our state and national associations do for them, their unit, and their families. Ask them to join and get involved. Our strength begins at the local unit level and we must focus our association recruiting efforts in our hometown units. If we take this challenge to heart, we can realistically gain 1,000 state association members by next year's state conference.

Second, our state and federal legislators need to hear your voice. Legislators want communication directly from their constituents. As an association we need a strong, unified voice. The larger the constituency, the more likely our federal and state legislators will want to support our constituency. Numbers are important! Visit the NGAUS Website and sign-up for the national legislative alerts and legislative newsletters. The association will request your personal email address when you submit your annual membership registration. You can also send me your personal email address to pearre@ktis.net. In turn, I will send you important national legislative alerts and provide you with information concerning current state legislative bills that affect our Airmen and Soldiers.

Third, take the opportunity to attend our national conferences. The EANGUS Conference will take place in Salt Lake City, 20-23 August 2006 and the NGAUS Conference will take place in Albuquerque, New Mexico, 16-18 September 2006. These conferences are a great opportunity for members to determine critical Guard issues and to establish the association's path and priorities for the upcoming year. (Most of all they are a great time!)

After presenting this initial challenge, I would like to share some additional thoughts with you. To succeed in our mission, we must work together with a clear and consistent message. As stated by our Past-President, "Per the bylaws, every senior command has two representatives to recruit/retain, communicate, and participate on the board and we will continue to do this. For carrying out our efforts at the local unit level, all senior commands must nominate unit representatives so that every unit in Missouri has a local representative to answer questions, distribute information, and recruit membership."

Professionals belong to professional organizations. All of our professional Airmen and Soldiers should belong to the Missouri National Guard Association. Every leader (NCO and Officer) needs to become a member of their state and national associations for their Airmen and Soldiers. Just as we wouldn't want to send our Airmen and Soldiers into harm's way without the proper equipment or weapons, why would we want to send our associations to work with Congress or our State Legislature without the support of every possible association member and the dues and constituency actions those resources represent.

During your recruiting efforts, nonmembers may ask what our associations have done for us lately. The answer to this question is simple "Just about everything", from funding and equipment...to pay, benefits, and quality of life initiatives. While a specific

piece of equipment or benefit doesn't come with a label, I can assure you that most everything we have was impacted by a combined effort that included our state and national associations.

To Succeed, We Need To:

- ◆ **Focus on our most important issues with a unified voice.**
- ◆ Improve membership and keep our members informed. Our fall membership drive must be a success (Every association member is a recruiter).
- ◆ Coordinate our efforts with our national associations (NGAUS & EANGUS), federal and state legislators, National Guard Bureau, etc.
- ◆ Communicate the "Guard" story; our strength, capabilities, and needs – our clear and consistent message.
- ◆ Energize our membership to participate in the political process. Write or contact your federal and state representatives. One of the last things elected officials do before voting on an issue is ask their staff: "What are our constituents telling us?" "How many calls and letters have we received?" and "What are they saying?" Those officials must hear from our association members on important Guard issues.
- ◆ **Together... We Will Succeed!**

CONFERENCE REPORTS

Enlisted Caucus Reports: The Enlisted Caucus was called to order by President Jim Lumpkin at 13:00 on Friday, 21 April in Kansas City, Missouri. Twenty-eight enlisted members were present.

President Lumpkin played a song called, "Soldiers in Heaven," written by Keith Bryant.

COL Michael McEnulty spoke to the Enlisted Caucus about his goals and plans for the Association if elected President-Elect of the Association.

President Jim Lumpkin gave the President's report which focused on enlisted membership in the Missouri National Guard Association. Membership has increased by more than 700 from last year at this time. As membership has increased, the Association's finances have also moved into the black.

President Lumpkin attended the EANGUS national conference in August. The State of Missouri was well-represented at the conference. The Adjutant General, MG King Sidwell, and the State Sergeant Major, CSM Gross, were present.

The floor was opened for nominations for 2007 President-Elect of the Enlisted. SFC Brenda Randles was elected. Nominations were made for Secretary of the Enlisted for 2006. MSgt Leah Caldwell was elected.

MSgt Leah Caldwell gave the EANGUS report. The 2006 Conference has been moved (due to Hurricane Katrina) from Biloxi, MS, to Salt Lake City, UT. "Mountains and Magnolias" will be 20-23 August. Membership is important for EANGUS as well as at the state level. One of the resolutions in progress to go to EANGUS would put into Federal Law protection for National Guard soldiers and airmen against discrimination when applying for a job.

The Enlisted caucus was turned over to SFC Susan Kelb, 2006 President of the Enlisted. SFC Kelb is from the 20th AVN BDE. Her goal for the upcoming year is to work on communication flow among the Enlisted - both down and up.

The Enlisted caucus was adjourned at 13:45.

Resolutions Committee Report: The Resolutions Committee met at 15:00, 21 April 2006. There were 19 Command Representatives in attendance.

Five EANGUS resolutions were brought forward for reaffirmation for the next legislative session. These pertained to: improving GI Bill benefits, full-time manning issues, and medical readiness issues to include covered annual dental examinations. All five resolutions were discussed and endorsed by the Committee.

There were twelve joint NGAUS resolutions submitted. These resolutions pertained to: TRICARE benefits to all guardsmen, lowering the retirement age from age 60 to 55, full-time manning, tax credits for employers and self-employed guardsmen. All twelve resolutions were discussed and endorsed by the Committee.

There were eight Army resolutions submitted. These resolutions pertained to: equipment modernization, funding for equipment left in theater by units prior to redeployment to home stations, and civil support team training. All eight resolutions were discussed and endorsed by the Committee.

There were twenty Air resolutions submitted. These resolutions pertained to: procurement of various types of aircraft and parts to enhance the Air Guard flying missions. All twenty resolutions were discussed. Four were rejected due to lack of cost effectiveness to the Air National Guard. The other sixteen were endorsed by the Committee.

Additionally, there were two resolutions brought to the Committee for discussion. The first relates to the first \$15,000 of pay received by guardsmen and reservists being exempt from state tax. The second relates would make all guardsmen eligible for the G-RAP program (to include full-timers) and allow full-timers to be eligible for reenlistment bonuses. The Committee discussed these resolutions and both were endorsed.

The Committee was adjourned at 15:50.

Insurance Trust Report: The Missouri National Guard Insurance Trust Board met Friday, 21 April 2006. The Insurance Trust currently has 971 active policies, with an average age of 51.2. Total premiums paid from March 2005 to March 2006 is

\$101,150.34 with our portion being \$40,460.00. Our experience refund last June was \$2,771.00.

There will be no Experience Refund this year, due to payouts on death claims of \$42,000 over what the pool took in.

The current bank balance is just over \$77,000. There will be expected expenditure of funds in 2006 for office upgrades.

The Insurance Trust Board has brought on TGS Insurance to administer the current program at no cost and to market supplemental programs.

The Board recognized MSG Sharon Belt for her service over the past two years and welcomes MSgt Steve Lorenz.

◆ **EANGUS UPDATE**

The following items are just a few of the benefits EANGUS and our State worked for and won in 2005:

Extension of Recruiting/Retention authorities

BAH Type II all but eliminated; moved threshold from 139 days of AD to less than 30 days for full BAH.

TRICARE for all Reservists

Use of MGIB for mobilized members use in securing licenses and certificates.

Reenlistment bonus eligibility extended from 16 to 20 years service.

Below are just a few bills EANGUS and our State are supporting this current Congressional Session:

HR 558 - S. 337 Guard and Reserve Readiness and Retention Act of 2005 -- Currently there are 154 cosponsors and this legislation has been introduced by Senator Lindsey O. Graham (R-SC) and Senator Hillary Rodham Clinton (D-NY) and Congressman Tom Latham (R-IA). The bill has two provisions as follows:

- Reserve retirement age is reduced from age 60 by one year for every two years served beyond 20 years of service. A minimum retirement age of 60 with 20 years of service, down to 53 with 34 years of service.
- Cost-share access to TRICARE for all members of National Guard/Reserves. (The TRICARE provision was adopted by the full Senate as an amendment during consideration of the National Defense Authorization Act in July, 2005.)

HR 838 - S. 1142 HELP at HOME Act - This legislation was introduced by Congressmen Tom Lantos (D-CA), Jim McGovern (D-MA), **Sam Graves (R-MO)** and Chris Shays (R-CT) and Senator Mary Landrieu (D-LA) to provide incentives for employers to make up the difference in pay when an employee is deployed to help address retention and recruitment issues in the military. Currently there are 99 cosponsors.

Specifically, the bills includes provisions to require the Federal government to eliminate the pay gap for its employees; creates a tax credit equal to 50% of the amount the employer pays to the National Guard/Reservist capped at \$30,000 per employee; and changes the way these differential payments are recorded. Also it offers tax credit for self employed members of the Select Reserves and a tax credit for small employers that hire replacement workers.

Status: The Senate passed a resolution to the Budget Resolution (S. Con. Res. 18) that would reserve a portion of the federal budget to fund this legislation. The resolution passed 99-0. Senator Landrieu has an amendment pending to the National Defense Authorization Act to include the provisions of this legislation.

HR 2484 Americans in Uniform Act of 2005 - **Sponsored by Congressman Blunt (R-MO)** with 18 cosponsors. The bill improves benefits for members of the National Guard and Reserve to recognize their service to the United States and to encourage the recruitment and retention of National Guard and Reserve personnel, and for other purposes.

The bill includes the following provisions:

- requires the Department of Defense (DOD), in awarding any contract for the procurement of goods and services, to use as an evaluation factor whether entities intend to carry out the contract using employees or individual subcontractors who are members of the Selected Reserve;
- Makes specified increases to the amount of hardship duty pay, reenlistment bonuses and family separation allowance;
- Makes eligible for burial in Arlington National Cemetery: (1) a member or former member of the reserves who was under age 60 at the time of death and who, but for such age, would have been eligible for military retired pay; and (2) his or her dependents;
- Makes eligible for space-available travel on DOD aircraft: (1) a member or former member of the reserves under 60 years of age who, but for such age, would be eligible for military retired pay; and (2) his or her spouse.
- Requires a report from the Comptroller General to Congress on difficulties faced by members of the NG and reserves with respect to employment as a result of being ordered to full-time NG duty or active-duty service.

Status: The procurement provision eligibility for Space A travel and increases to special military pay and compensation provisions were included in the House version of the NDAA.

HR 1371 Eliminates the 1/30th Rule - Legislation introduced by Representative Shelly Moore Capitol (R-WV) to provide full rate compensation for the following incentive pays: Aviation Career Incentive Pay, Career Enlisted Flight Incentive Pay, Hazardous Duty Incentive Pay, Dive special Pay and Foreign Language Incentive Pay. Specifically, the bill eliminates the current 1/30th rule which provides that members of the Selected Reserves are entitled to 1/3 of a month incentive pay for each day active duty is performed. HB 1398 FN 3297 Pearce, David	Changes the laws regarding military facilities and personnel
HB 1459 Franz, Ward	Allows a person to present military identification or a DD Form 214 Report of Separation in lieu of a hunter education certificate to obtain a hunting permit
HB 1478 Johnson, Rick	Requires that the US and Missouri flags be flown at half-staff on each day that a member of the U.S. armed services dies in the service of his or her country and on the day immediately following
HB 1482 FN 4614 Jackson, Jack	Modifies the requirements for receipt of a National Guard educational assistance grant.
HB 1510	Prohibits any entity from preventing a student athlete from competing in or training for any Olympic event

Summary of SCS/SBs 701 & 948 - This act provides that if a recipient of educational assistance under the act ceases to maintain their active military affiliation while enrolled in an academic semester or term at an institution of higher education for any reason except death, disability, or medical disqualification, the educational assistance shall be terminated and the recipient shall be required to repay any amounts awarded under this section. The act also eliminates the provision which states that the recipient must repay assistance awarded if he or she ceases to maintain their military affiliation within three years after completion of a course of study.
